Re-engage your school community with The Fathering Project

National harm prevention charity The Fathering Project have launched a range of new school programs designed to improve child development outcomes by engaging fathers and father figures.

There is irrefutable research evidence from here and overseas that shows children who have a father or father figure supporting their learning journey have considerably better developmental outcomes.

This means students with reduced behaviour issues, better mental health, improved capacity for self control and social responsibility and significantly improved academic success.

Importantly, the research shows that engaging fathers leads to stronger school communities where students, staff and parents feel more connected to each other, boosting wellbeing and enjoyment of the learning process for everyone.

Developed in partnership with development and educational experts, The Fathering Project school programs include –

- Evidence-based information for fathers on relevant topics such as supporting learning, positive discipline and encouraging resilience.
- Events and activities for schools to share with fathers and families to build engagement, skills and knowledge
- Conversation starters for schools, fathers and families on relevant issues impacting education, development and wellbeing.
- Step-by-step support, tools and professional development resources for staff.

Schools have the option of choosing a level of support that aligns with community need or available budget.
